JOHN 11:38-44 | "Lazarus Lives!"

3 Now this is eternal life: that they know you, the only true God, and Jesus Christ, whom you have sent.

Jesus performed many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not recorded in this book. But these are written that you may believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name.

Now a man named Lazarus was sick. He was from Bethany, the village of Mary and her sister Martha.

So the sisters sent word to Jesus, "Lord, the one you love is sick."

So when he heard that Lazarus was sick, he stayed where he was two more days

Now Jesus loved Martha and her sister and Lazarus. So (therefore) when he heard that Lazarus was sick, he stayed where he was two more days

When he heard this, Jesus said, "This sickness will not end in death. No, it is for God's glory so that God's Son may be glorified through it."

... "if you had been here, my brother would not have died."

Jesus said to her, "I am the resurrection and the life. The one who believes in me will live, even though they die; and whoever lives by believing in me will never die. Do you believe this?"

When Jesus saw her (Mary) weeping, and the Jews who had come along with her also weeping, he was deeply moved in spirit and troubled. "Where have you laid him?" he asked.

"Come and see, Lord," they replied.

When Jesus saw her sobbing and the Jews with her sobbing, a deep anger welled up within him. He said, "Where did you put him?"

Jesus wept.

Then the Jews said, "See how he loved him!"
But some of them said, "Could not he who
opened the eyes of the blind man have kept
this man from dying?"

Jesus, once more deeply moved, came to the tomb. It was a cave with a stone laid across the entrance. "Take away the stone," he said.

"But, Lord," said Martha, the sister of the dead man, "by this time there is a bad odor, for he has been there four days."

Then Jesus said, "Did I not tell you that if you believe, you will see the glory of God?"

But the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you all things and will remind you of everything I have said to you.

So they took away the stone. Then Jesus looked up and said, "Father, I thank you that you have heard me. I knew that you always hear me, but I said this for the benefit of the people standing here, that they may believe that you sent me."

When he had said this, Jesus called in a loud voice, "Lazarus, come out!" The dead man came out, his hands and feet wrapped with strips of linen, and a cloth around his face.

Jesus said to them, "Take off the grave clothes and let him go."

So from that day on they plotted to take his life.

Therefore many of the Jews who had come to visit Mary, and had seen what Jesus did, believed in him.

If we let him go on like this, everyone will believe in him, and then the Romans will come and take away both our temple and our nation."

Yet to all who did receive him, to those who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God
